World music study-performance camps in New England, Oregon,

Since 1990 the teen & adult singers of Village Harmony camps have been traveling and performing throughout New England and an ever-widening swath of the globe, participating in cultural exchanges and delighting audiences with their heart-felt renditions of unusual choral music from around the world.

Village Harmony Camp is an un-auditioned, inclusive program whose basic demand of would-be members is that they be honestly invested in making music. The result has been ensembles whose sound remains dynamic and unpredictable—and absolutely exciting year after year. With seemingly easy command of phenomenally varied singing styles and infectiously joyous stage presence, Village Harmony ensembles *always* knock people's socks off.

Each camp session begins with a week of rehearsal in residence somewhere. Our US rehearsal retreats this coming year will take place in western Massachusetts and the Oregon Cascades. Our overseas programs will meet in eastern Germany, the northern UK, Bosnia-Herzegovina and the Mediterranean island of Corsica.

Our basic model for each camp session, regardless of location, is the same. During the rehearsal week singers get to know one another and their music. Participants learn the basics of new singing styles and prepare a concert program under expert directors and

with emphasis on the cultural context and authentic vocal technique of the genres making up each session's particular musical tapestry. Rehearsals are long and intense—six hours or more each day—with individual voice coaching and small ensemble and instrumental work between group sessions. We place tremendous emphasis on authenticity, understanding the spirit and vocal style of each musical genre, and appreciating the joy of singing together and with conviction.

Within this rigorous structure camp groups tend none-the-less to be very relaxed and non-competitive, with a deliberately democratic atmosphere. The framework of each residency is communal, with everyone helping to cook and clean. The menu is primarily vegetarian, and is responsive to the tastes, dietary needs and culinary talents of camp participants. During the rehearsal week there is usually an evening cabaret, where campers are encouraged to flaunt their flair for music, stand-up comedy or random talents.

After the rehearsal week each session takes its show on the road. The shorter residential camps wrap up with a short concert series within driving distance of their retreat center. But for participants in the traveling camp sessions the adventure is just beginning! After the first concert, everyone and everything gets packed up as the group embarks upon a one- to two-week-long concert tour. While on tour the ensemble travels nearly every day—stopping en route to hike and swim and explore sites of interest—and performs virtually every night. The intense immersion in new repertoires and the myriad challenges of polishing concert performances to a high sheen are exhilarating for all involved, and produce a close community by the end of camp.



We are committed to making Village Harmony programs accessible by keeping expenses and tuition fees as low as possible, and we offer generous financial aid. In recent years we have greatly expanded our scholarship program for inner-city students in our teen camps, as well as offering full support to economically-disadvantaged students from eastern Europe and South Africa to come to the US to participate in our teen traveling camps.

New England Teen Camp I: June 21-July 10

Led by Larry Gordon, Brendan Taaffe, Heidi Wilson, Tatiana Sarbinska

Repertoire will include Renaissance works with instrumental accompaniment, shape-note tunes and folk music from South Africa, Corsica, the French Occitan region and Appalachia. There will be a lot of folk dancing—Balkan, English, contras—at this session. We'd love to have singers who are also instrument players attend. Following the rehearsal week an ensuing tour will take the group throughout New England.

New England Teen Camp II: July 6-25

VH alumni Will Thomas Rowan and Lynn Mahoney Rowan will lead the group in an eclectic selection of their own compositions, songs from Bulgaria, Scandinavia, and Quebec, and Italian madrigals. Singer-composer Artūras Sinkevičius will teach 2- and 3-part Lithuanian songs and will put together a band with any interested instrumentalists. The group will rehearse for a week in western Massachusetts, with an ensuing 12-day tour including some of our favorite stops in rural New England. *Rehearse at Stump Sprouts, Hawley, MA

New England Teen Camp III: July 26-August 14

This will be a great session for singers who want to stretch their musical boundaries by learning and performing music from some of the most exciting polyphonic traditions in the world: South African gospel, folk and struggle songs, and traditional songs from Sardinia, Corsica, and Albania, as well as American shape-note and protest songs. Lysander will lead any singer-instrumentalists in Balkan band pieces.

New England Teen Residential Camp: August 3-12

This is our nine-day camp, aimed at teenagers new to Village Harmony or those who don't have time to commit three weeks to a traveling camp. Traditional shape-note, gospel quartet and Appalachian harmonies, vocal jazz, songs from the Balkans & more. The session will culminate with two concerts. The camp will be in residence in a delightfully eccentric Victorian mansion with a nearby swimming lake in western Massachusetts.

Oregon Cascades Camp: July 29-August 4

The week, famous among VH camps for its kitchen staffed with singing chefs, will include a Georgian feast at mid-week. St. Benedict's Lodge in McKenzie, Oregon, at the edge of the Willamette National Forest, is an inspiring setting for singing. Black spirituals and gospel music, songs from Caucasus Georgia, and traditional and ancient forms of singing from the US and the Mediterranean. Bring your instruments to play for dancing.

New England Adult Camp: August 18-25

A 7-day residential singing camp for adults in the hills of western Massachusetts led by an especially exciting trio of directors. Dance-songs from South Africa, traditional Appalachian songs, shape-note music and sea shanties from America, music from Sardinia and Corsica, and more. The Buxton School, has a beautiful campus with excellent singing and dancing spaces. The camp will conclude with two concerts.

Corsica: June 19-July 7

Our eight VH camp in Corsica since 2004, this is a 19-day session intended for experienced students and adults who are confident enough to tackle the challenges of learning Corsican traditional music—with its elaborate ornamentation and precise intonation—by ear, and to sing one on a part in a small ensemble. We will be based in Canari in



rooms and apartments in *I Fioretti*, a renovated 18th-century convent turned *gite*. After the initial period we will give a series of concerts of our own in some of Corsica's beautiful village churches and explore the island, with a 2-night stay in a coastal village near Ajaccio.

Bosnia-Herzegovina:

June 25-July 9

Our fourth camp in Bosnia, in collaboration with the *Center for Peacebuilding* in the town of Sanski Most. Participants in this camp will explore Bosnia's rich, diverse vocal music from both village and urban traditions of the Croatian, Serbian and Muslim peoples who live there. After our rehearsal week in Sanski Most we will travel to Jajce, Donji Vakuf, Bugojno, Konjic, Fojnica and finally Sarajevo.

The camp is already nearly full, with space left only for youth singers and/or men.

Germany-Estonia: July 14-August 1

Led by Larry Gordon, Bongani Magatyana, Nathaniel Damon

This session begins in residence in Laage, a small town in former East Germany, and ends with five days at the *2018 Europa Cantat Festival* in Tallinn, Estonia. Camp repertoire will feature South African songs and dances, traditional Georgian, Balkan and American songs and a set of early music. A six-day performance tour around Mecklenburg, in Buchholz and in Hamburg will be followed by a short flight to Tallinn where we will spend our final days. Registration, food and lodging at *Europa Cantat* is included in the tuition price; airfare from Hamburg to Tallinn is extra.

Northern UK: August 6-20

Led by Larry Gordon, Bongani Magatyana, David Oliver

Our Northern UK camp features traditional instrumental dance music and we are looking for good instrumentalists (and dancers) as well as singers. During the rehearsal week we will have morning and evening dance sessions and on tour we will present some contra and ceilidh dances in our concert program. Singing will focus on South African dance-songs, American shape-note music, Balkan songs, and English traditional and political songs. A seven day tour will include Northumberland, southwest Scotland and the Lake District. The two-week program will culminate with a workshop and performance at the *Whitby Folk Week*, one of the UK's biggest folk festivals.

Village Harmony is a not-for-profit 501(c)(3) organization based in central Vermont, USA with activities around the world that welcomes singers of all colors, creeds, ethnicities, nationalities, orientations and socio-economic backgrounds

Unlike choirs whose goal is to achieve a seamless blend of voices, Village Harmony is composed of ad-hoc, non-auditioned, inclusive groups whose basic demand of would-be members is that they commit to making good music and not hold back. Our teen camps are open to young singers ages 11-19. Older teenagers are also welcome to join in any of our adult camps or workshops.

Auditions aren't required to attend Village Harmony camps or workshops, but we do want to know a few things about each applicant and his/her singing background. Our experience is that Village Harmony camps are self-selecting: if the idea of rehearsing seven hours a day and galumphing about the countryside touring makes you excited, then we want you.

You may apply for a camp session online at any time after the season's schedule is announced. We will begin to send out acceptance emails for summer camps in early January, and thereafter singers will be accepted on a rolling basis until the camps are filled. Some sessions fill up early, but sometimes space opens up as summer approaches, so we encourage late applicants.

First-time teenage applicants to Village Harmony need to have a music teacher or other adult send us a reference separately. This form can be downloaded from our website.

Tuition covers basic camp expenses, including housing, ground transportation during camp, music and most meals. Singers enrolled in the traveling camps can expect to have to buy a few meals during the performance tour. Airfare or other transportation to and from camp is not included in the tuition. For overseas camps, we will investigate flight options but ask that you purchase your own tickets.

We offer generous financial aid for our teen camps. You can download a **financial aid application form** from our website or during the online application process. This form must be fully completed and signed and sent in to the Village Harmony office as soon as possible to complete your camp application.
